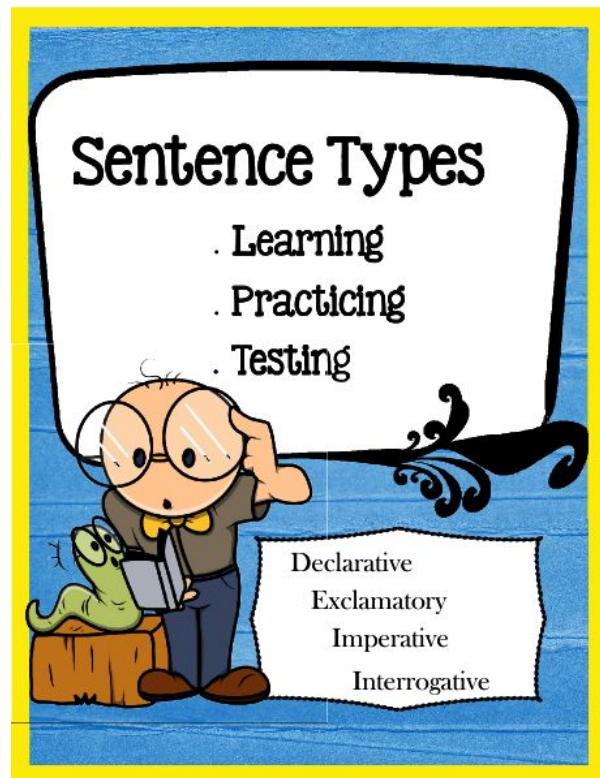


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Sentence Types

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Declarative

A sentence that makes a statement. It ends with a period.

•

Interrogative

A sentence that asks a question. It ends with a question mark.

?

Exclamatory

A sentence that shows a strong emotion. It ends with an exclamation mark.

Imperative

A sentence that gives a command. It can end with a period or an exclamation mark.
